



Wilderness Adventure Therapy® Practicum

- Weekend experiential -

An exciting opportunity to gain insight into the practical issues of providing physically and psychologically safe Wilderness Adventure Therapy® or related outdoor programs. The practicum has been developed for mental health professionals, teachers and youth workers who work in the field with outdoor leaders. In addition, outdoor leaders seeking to develop better practices with challenging behaviour in wilderness adventure programs will find this training highly relevant. The practicum orientates non-outdoor trained professionals to effective, in-the-field risk-management. The aim is to develop a practical awareness of environmental and medical conditions and risks - and the interaction of these factors with behaviour. Emphasis is given to responding effectively to these risks with a team-based approach.

Course Content & Prerequisites

The Practicum is an experience—based training that requires participants to undertake a short bushwalking expedition in a spectacular, semi-remote area. In addition, there may be a short abseiling option. Theory sessions are delivered in the field and practical exercises are used to illustrate key concepts. The Practicum content will emphasise prevention through the identification of predisposing risk factors, pre-existing conditions, and clinical crises that can lead to medical, psychological and behavioural incidents. Attention will be given to emergency response & evacuation. Participants will be required to carry packs over uneven ground and camp away from amenities. However, the experience will



be geared to the level of the least able participant, and can be undertaken by any person of average fitness and good health. Prior training through the *Introduction to WAT Course* would be an advantage but is not essential.
